TO THE MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES SENATE:

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce strongly opposes S. Con. Res. 14, the FY 2022 budget resolution. It would enable a \$3.5 trillion reconciliation bill that would dramatically expand the size and scope of government through record levels of inflationary spending, impose massive tax increases, and halt America's economic recovery. **We will consider including votes on this legislation and amendments in our "How They Voted" Congressional scorecard**

The United States faces significant near-term and long-term budgetary challenges but rather than attempting to address those challenges, this budget resolution is being considered for the sole purpose of creating a mechanism to advance one of the largest fiscal packages in history on a completely partisan basis.

The success of the bipartisan infrastructure negotiations provides a much better model for how Congress should proceed in addressing America's problems. We urge you to reject the budget resolution.
