TO THE MEMBERS OF THE U.S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce strongly supports H.R. 4634, the “Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2019,” which would provide for a long-term reauthorization of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act (“TRIA”) program. **The Chamber will consider including votes on this legislation in our annual *How They Voted* scorecard.**

Since its initial enactment in 2002, TRIA has served as a vital public-private risk sharing mechanism, ensuring that private terrorism risk insurance coverage remains commercially available and that the U.S. economy would more swiftly recover in the event of a terrorist attack.

H.R. 4634 represents a bipartisan agreement between Chairwoman Waters and Ranking Member McHenry that would provide a seven-year reauthorization of this important program while providing for a study on the evolving risks in cyber-terrorism and the affordability and availability of TRIA coverage for places of worship.

The Chamber strongly urges you to vote in support of H.R. 4634.
