## ORDER

For the reasons stated in the accompanying Memorandum Opinion, it is hereby

ORDERED that [52] Plaintiffs' Partial Motion for Summary

Judgment on Their Listing Claims is GRANTED IN PART and DENIED

IN PART; and it is further

ORDERED that [53] Federal Defendants' Partial Motion for Summary Judgment on the Listing Claims and [56] Defendant-Intervenors' Cross-Motion for Partial Summary Judgment are

GRANTED IN PART and DENIED IN PART; and it is further

ORDERED that the threatened listing determination for the northern long-eared bat is not vacated but is REMANDED to the Fish and Wildlife Service ("FWS") to make a new listing decision consistent with the accompanying Memorandum Opinion; and it is further

ORDERED that the provision of the Significant Portion of Range Policy which provides that if FWS and the National Marine Fisheries Service ("the Services") determine that a species is threatened throughout all of its range, the Services will not analyze whether the species is endangered in a significant portion of its range is VACATED.
