

Research Objectives & Methodology



- A current and updated deep dive into the current status of those who lost jobs or were furloughed during the pandemic and have not returned to work; augments earlier polling conducted in May and November of 2021
- Probe further into a variety of areas of inquiry that can help us projectably quantify and profile:
 - Behaviors
 - Expectations
 - Attitudes
 - Motivations (or lack thereof) behind both the U-3 and U-6 unemployed
- Identify any meaningful differences across a variety of demographics and employment history traits.
- Look to shifts or trends from comparable earlier insights (May'21, November'21)

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METHODOLOGICAL SPECIFICS:

- 15 Minute Online Survey of those unemployed during the pandemic who have not returned to full time employment
- In Tab Final Sample of 514 American Adults; yields overall survey margin of error +/-4.3% at the 95% confidence level
 - Balanced across the four U.S. Census Regions and population densities
 - o 54% Female
 - Stable and Projectable bases, quotas across age, prior total compensation, ethnicity, incidence of children at home, industry sector and educational attainment
 - As with the prior wave of this wave of research, respondents over the age of 65 were excluded from the study






One in Five Have Altered Their Livelihoods

Of those losing their full time job during the pandemic:


- 19% are homemakers

- **Q.** How would you best describe your current work status?




• Residents in the Northeast and South as well as higher incomes are more likely to be retired.

Q. What was your estimated total annual compensation including all wages, bonuses and tips?






Note May'21 data included respondents age 65+ Average income of the COVID unemployed, increase from \$37k to \$40k




Those Losing Their Jobs Were Not Long Term Employees

- More than five years




Those More Likely to have been employed for shorter periods of time:

- Partially vaccinated




More Than One In Ten Have Left Multiple Jobs During the Pandemic

- Six out of ten multiple job holders lasted three months or less in their most recent job

Q. Why did you leave your most recent job?




They are Significantly More Likely Than the Population at Large, to be Unvaccinated for COVID 19 (and not to get vaccinated in the future).


Q. Have you been partially vaccinated (one shot), totally vaccinated (both shots) or not at all vaccinated against COVID 19?




- Totally vaccinated




The Majority Aren't Actively Job Searching

And Have Reduced Their Job Seeking Activities


Q. Please indicate which, if any of the following, you have done in the past three weeks.



• Only 9% of those currently unemployed and losing their job during the pandemic have turned down a job offer at any time since April 2020. This is up from November but still down from 13% in May 2021.











Parents, particularly mothers, cannot work because closures or shortened hours at schools and daycare require them to stay home...


We'll see significant growth in U.S. employment, once we are past the COVID pandemic

There are a lot of people who are not looking for work because they can do almost or just as well, collecting unemployment benefits


The jobs that are available right now offer few opportunities for promotions, raises or opportunities for advancement.

Too many good jobs have moved overseas, and that is making it difficult for Americans to find work.








Incentives to Bring People Back to Work Have Lost Some of Their Impact

Q. Which of the following, if any, would increase your urgency to return to full time employment?




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
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
Nearly One Half Don't Expect To Be Back Before 2023
