MOTION TO CONSIDER PREVIOUSLY-FILED BRIEF OF AMICI CURIAE IN CONNECTION WITH THE RENEWED PETITION FOR REHEARING EN BANC

Amici Curiae The Chamber of Commerce of the United States of America (the "Chamber"), the Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America ("PhRMA"), and the Product Liability Advisory Council, Inc. ("PLAC") (together, "Amici") respectfully move the Court to consider, when deciding the Renewed Petition for Rehearing En Banc filed by Appellee Monsanto Company on November 4, 2022, the brief previously filed by Amici (with leave of this Court) in support of Monsanto's initial Petition for Rehearing. In support of this motion and in demonstration of good cause, Amici state as follows:

1. On July 12, 2022, a panel of this Court issued an opinion reversing the judgment of the district court. On August 2, 2022, Monsanto filed a Petition for

Rehearing *En Banc* (the "Initial Petition"). On August 9, 2022, *Amici* filed an unopposed motion for leave to file a brief in support of Monsanto's Initial Petition. On September 6, 2022, the Court granted the motion and on the same date, the brief of *Amici* was filed. On October 28, 2002, the panel vacated its opinion and substituted a new opinion, thus mooting the then-pending Initial Petition.

- 2. On November 4, 2022, Monsanto filed a Renewed Petition for Rehearing *En Banc* (the "Renewed Petition"), in which it made the same fundamental points it made in its Initial Petition.
- 3. In the view of *Amici*, the panel's substitute opinion raises the same concerns as its original opinion, and the points raised in the brief previously filed by *Amici* remain applicable to the substitute opinion and the Renewed Petition. Accordingly, *Amici* respectfully request that the Court, in deciding whether to grant the Renewed Petition, consider the brief previously filed by *Amici* and available to the Court in the docket of this case (See Docket Entry for September 6, 2022, 1:39 PM). *Amici* suggest that the Court should do so for the same good cause that persuaded the Court to grant *Amici* leave to file the brief.

CONCLUSION

Amici respectfully urge the Court to consider the brief previously filed by Amici in support of the Initial Petition, and for the reasons set forth in that brief and in the Renewed Petition, grant the Renewed Petition.
