INTRODUCTION

1
2 1. Particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in diameter (“PM2.5”), sometimes referred to as
3 fine particulate, is a major cause of serious air quality problems in many parts of the United
4 States. Exposure to PM2.5 causes numerous human respiratory problems, including decreased
5 lung function, asthma and bronchitis, and is also associated with premature mortality, hospital
6 admissions, cardiopulmonary disease and lung cancer. The detrimental effects of PM2.5 are not
7 limited to human health; PM2.5 also contributes to regional haze, thereby contributing to the
8 visibility range limitations in some of our Nation’s most treasured areas.

9 2. To better protect the public from the damage caused by PM2.5, the United States
10 Environmental Protection Agency (“EPA”) promulgated a revision to the PM2.5 National
11 Ambient Air Quality Standard in 2006. Under the Clean Air Act, each state and territory of the
12 United States is required to submit a plan, within three years of the promulgation or revision of
13 new National Ambient Air Quality Standard, which addresses specific requirements to provide
14 for the implementation, maintenance and enforcement of the new PM2.5 standard. These are
15 known as “Infrastructure” state implementation plans. Without Infrastructure plans, citizens are
16 not afforded full protection against the harmful effects of PM2.5.

17 3. EPA is required to take final action on a state’s Infrastructure state implementation plan
18 submittal by approving in full, disapproving in full, or approving in part and disapproving in part
19 within 12 months of the date a submittal is deemed administratively complete. Furthermore, if a
20 state failed to submit their Infrastructure state implementation plan by the required date, EPA is
21 required to issue a finding stating so, known as a “finding of failure to submit.” EPA has failed
22 to take final action on at least six states’ Infrastructure state implementation plan submittals.
23 Additionally, EPA has failed to issue a finding of failure to submit a sufficient Infrastructure
24 state implementation plan for at least 32 states and territories. Accordingly, Plaintiffs
25 WILDEARTH GUARDIANS and SIERRA CLUB bring this action against Defendant LISA P.
26 JACKSON, in her official capacity as EPA Administrator, to compel her to perform her
27 mandatory duty with respect to these PM2.5 Infrastructure state implementation plans.

1 **JURISDICTION**

2 4. This case is a Clean Air Act citizen suit. Therefore, the Court has jurisdiction over this
3 action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331 (federal question jurisdiction) and 42 U.S.C. § 7604(a)(2)
4 (citizen suits for failure to perform a non-discretionary duty required by the Clean Air Act).

5 **NOTICE**

6 5. WildEarth Guardians and Sierra Club mailed to EPA by certified mail, return receipt
7 requested, written notice of intent to sue regarding the violations alleged in this Complaint. EPA
8 received the notice letter on October 13, 2010. More than sixty days have passed since EPA
9 received the notice letter. EPA has not remedied the violations alleged in this Complaint.
10 Therefore, a present and actual controversy exists between the parties.

11 **VENUE**

12 6. Defendant EPA resides in this judicial district. This civil action is brought against an
13 officer of the United States acting in her official capacity and a substantial part of the events or
14 omissions giving rise to the claims in this case occurred in the Northern District of California.
15 One of the claims in this Complaint concerns EPA's failure to perform mandatory duties with
16 regard to Hawaii. EPA Region 9, whose jurisdiction includes Hawaii, is headquartered in San
17 Francisco. Thus several of the events and omissions at issue in this action occurred at EPA's
18 Region 9 headquarters in San Francisco. In addition, Plaintiff Sierra Club is headquartered in
19 San Francisco and Sierra Club's counsel is located in San Francisco. Therefore, venue is proper
20 in this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1391(e).

21 **INTRADISTRICT ASSIGNMENT**

22 7. A substantial part of the events and omissions giving rise to the claims in this case
23 occurred in the County of San Francisco. Accordingly, assignment to the San Francisco Division
24 or the Oakland Division is proper pursuant to Civil L.R. 3-2(c) and (d).

25 **PARTIES**

26 8. Plaintiff WILDEARTH GUARDIANS is a non-profit conservation organization with
27 offices in Arizona, Colorado, and New Mexico. WildEarth Guardians protects and restores wild
28 rivers, wildlife and wild places in the American West. A critical component of this work is

1 helping to foster an ethic of appreciation by allowing people to enjoy such wildlife, wild rivers
2 and wild places.

3 9. Members and volunteers of WildEarth Guardians live, work, study, recreate, engage in
4 other economic activities and obtain spiritual benefits, and will continue to do so regularly, in
5 and around areas impacted by air pollution from Alaska, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Montana,
6 Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

7 10. Plaintiff SIERRA CLUB is a national grassroots nonprofit conservation organization
8 formed in 1872. Sierra Club's purpose includes practicing and promoting the responsible use of
9 earth's ecosystems and resources, and protecting and restoring the quality of the natural and
10 human environment.

11 11. Sierra Club has over 750,000 members nationally. Members and staff of Sierra Club
12 live, work, recreate, and travel throughout the areas at issue in this case and will continue to do
13 so on a regular basis. PM2.5 in the affected states and territories threatens, and will continue to
14 threaten, the health and welfare of the Sierra Club's staff and members. Sierra Club staff's and
15 members', as well as the public's, ability to enjoy the aesthetic qualities and recreational
16 opportunities is diminished in the respective areas impacted by PM2.5.

17 12. EPA's failure to timely perform the mandatory duties described herein also adversely
18 affects WildEarth Guardians and Sierra Club, as well as their staff and members, by depriving
19 them of procedural protection and opportunities as well as information which they are entitled to
20 under the Clean Air Act. The failure of EPA to perform the mandatory duties also creates
21 uncertainty for WildEarth Guardians' and Sierra Club's staff and members as to whether they are
22 exposed to excess air pollution.

23 13. The above injuries will continue until the Court grants the relief requested herein.

24 14. Defendant LISA P. JACKSON is the Administrator of the United States Environmental
25 Protection Agency. In that role Administrator Jackson has been charged by Congress with the
26 duty to administer the Clean Air Act, including the mandatory duties at issue in this case.

LEGAL BACKGROUND

15. Congress enacted the Clean Air Act to “speed up, expand, and intensify the war against air pollution in the United States with a view to assuring that the air we breathe throughout the Nation is wholesome once again.” H.R.Rep. No. 1146, 91st Cong., 2d Sess. 1,1, 1970 U.S.Code Cong. & Admin. News 5356, 5356. To promote this, the Act requires EPA to set National Ambient Air Quality Standards for certain pollutants, including PM_{2.5}. National Ambient Air Quality Standards establish maximum allowable concentrations in the air of these pollutants.

16. Each National Ambient Air Quality Standard must be stringent enough to protect public health and welfare. Effects on welfare include, but are not limited to, effects on soils, water, vegetation, manmade materials, wildlife, visibility (*i.e.*, haze), climate, damage to property, economic impacts and effects on personal comfort and well-being.

17. The Clean Air Act requires each state to submit a state implementation plan for every promulgation or revision of a National Ambient Air Quality Standard, within three years of that standard’s promulgation or revision, that provides for the “implementation, maintenance, and enforcement” of the standard. 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(1). These are often referred to as “Infrastructure” state implementation plans.

18. An Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal must meet the requirements listed under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2). See 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(M).

19. The Clean Air Act requires EPA to determine whether any state implementation plan submittal is administratively complete. See 42 U.S.C. 7410(k)(1)(B). If, six months after a state submits a state implementation plan, EPA has not made the completeness finding and has not found the submittal to be incomplete, the submittal is deemed administratively complete by operation of law. Id.

20. EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action on any administratively complete state implementation plan submittal by approving in full, disapproving in full or approving in part and disapproving in part within 12 months of the date it is deemed administratively complete. 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2).

21. If a state fails to submit any required state implementation plan, there is no submittal that may be deemed administratively complete and EPA must make a determination stating that the state failed to submit the required state implementation plan. 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B). This is referred to as a “finding of failure to submit.”

STATE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN SUBMITTALS

22. On October 17, 2006, EPA promulgated a revision to the PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient Air Quality Standard. 71 Fed. Reg. 61144 (Oct. 17, 2006). The effective date of the new standard is December 18, 2006. *Id.*

23. On January 15, 2009, either EPA or operation of law deemed Alabama’s 2006 PM_{2.5} infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. *See* EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Alabama (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/al_infrabypoll.html) (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).¹

24. On May 18, 2009, either EPA or operation of law deemed Connecticut’s 2006 PM_{2.5} infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the prevention of significant deterioration (“PSD”) element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. *See* EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Connecticut (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/ct_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6, 2010).

25. On January 6, 2008, either EPA or operation of law deemed Florida’s 2006 PM_{2.5} infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. *See* EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—

3 26. On May 28, 2008, either EPA or operation of law deemed Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5
4 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. §
5 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
6 Mississippi (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/ms_infrabypoll.html)
7 (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).³

8 27. Additionally, on March 22, 2009, either EPA or operation of law deemed Mississippi's
9 2006 PM2.5 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element
10 of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. Id.

11 28. On June 17, 2007, either EPA or operation of law deemed North Carolina's 2006 PM2.5
12 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C.
13 § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
14 North Carolina (available at
15 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/nc_infrabypoll.html) (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).⁴

4 Tennessee (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/tn_infrabypoll.html)
5 (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).⁵

6 CLAIMS FOR RELIEF

7 CLAIM ONE

8 (EPA's Failure to Take Final Action on Six States' 2006 PM_{2.5} Infrastructure State
9 Implementation Plan Submittals)

10
11 30. Plaintiffs incorporate by reference paragraphs 1 through 29.

12 31. The Clean Air Act requires EPA to determine whether any state implementation plan
13 submittal is administratively complete. See 42 U.S.C. 7410(k)(1)(B).

14 32. If, six months after a state submits a state implementation plan, EPA has not made the
15 completeness finding and has not found the submittal to be incomplete, the submittal is deemed
16 administratively complete by operation of law. Id.

17 33. EPA must take final action on an administratively complete submittal by approving in
18 full, disapproving in full, or approving in part and disapproving in part within 12 months of the
19 date of the submittal's completeness finding. 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2).

20 34. On January 15, 2009, either EPA or operation of law deemed Alabama's 2006 PM_{2.5}
21 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C.
22 § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
23 Alabama (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/al_infrabypoll.html) (as
24 viewed Oct. 7, 2010).

25
26 ⁵ It appears that Tennessee made another submittal that either EPA or operation of law deemed

1 35. Thus, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2), EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action
2 on Alabama's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the
3 visibility element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than January 15, 2010.

4 36. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
5 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part Alabama's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state
6 implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. §
7 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by January 15, 2010.

8 37. On May 18, 2009, either EPA or operation of law deemed Connecticut's 2006 PM2.5
9 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. §
10 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
11 Connecticut (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/ct_infrabypoll.html)
12 (last viewed Dec. 6, 2010).

13 38. Thus, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2), EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action
14 on Connecticut's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the
15 PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than May 18, 2010.

16 39. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
17 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part Connecticut's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state
18 implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II)
19 by May 18, 2010.

20 40. On January 6, 2008, either EPA or operation of law deemed Florida's 2006 PM2.5
21 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. §
22 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
23 Florida (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/fl_infrabypoll.html) (as
24 viewed Oct. 7, 2010).

25 41. Thus, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2), EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action
26 on Florida's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD
27 element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than January 6, 2009.

1 42. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
2 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part Florida's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state
3 implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II)
4 by January 6, 2009.

5 43. On May 28, 2008, either EPA or operation of law deemed Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5
6 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. §
7 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
8 Mississippi (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/ms_infrabypoll.html)
9 (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010)..

10 44. Thus, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2), EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action
11 on Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the
12 PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than May 28, 2009.

13 45. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
14 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state
15 implementation plan submittal addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II)
16 by May 28, 2009.

17 46. On March 22, 2009, either EPA or operation of law deemed Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5
18 infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C.
19 § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
20 Mississippi (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/ms_infrabypoll.html)
21 (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).

22 47. EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action on Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5
23 Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C.
24 § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than March 22, 2010.

25 48. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
26 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part Mississippi's 2006 PM2.5 Infrastructure state
27 implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. §
28 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by March 22, 2010.

1 49. Either EPA or operation of law deemed North Carolina's infrastructure state
2 implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. §
3 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete on June 17, 2007. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure
4 Requirements—North Carolina (available at
5 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/nc_infrabypoll.html) (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).

6 50. Thus, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2), EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action
7 on North Carolina's 2006 PM_{2.5} Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing
8 the visibility component of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than June 17, 2008.

9 51. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
10 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part North Carolina's 2006 PM_{2.5} Infrastructure
11 state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. §
12 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by June 17, 2008.

13 52. On October 4, 2008, either EPA or operation of law deemed Tennessee's infrastructure
14 state implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. §
15 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) complete. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—
16 Tennessee (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/tn_infrabypoll.html)
17 (as viewed Oct. 7, 2010).

18 53. Thus, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2), EPA has a mandatory duty to take final action
19 on Tennessee's 2006 PM_{2.5} Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal addressing the
20 visibility element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by no later than October 4, 2009.

21 54. EPA has failed to perform this mandatory duty by not approving in full, disapproving in
22 full, or approving in part and disapproving in part Tennessee's 2006 PM_{2.5} Infrastructure state
23 implementation plan submittal addressing the visibility element of 42 U.S.C. §
24 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) by October 4, 2009.

25 55. Accordingly, EPA is in violation of its mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2) to
26 take final action on Infrastructure state implementation plan submittals by Alabama,
27 Connecticut, Florida, Mississippi, North Carolina and Tennessee. This violation of a mandatory
28 duty is ongoing.

CLAIM TWO

(EPA's Failure to Make Findings of Failure to Submit Sufficient Infrastructure State Implementation Plans for the 2006 PM2.5 National Ambient Air Quality Standard)

56. Plaintiffs incorporate by reference paragraphs 1 through 55.

57. Pursuant to the Clean Air Act, each state must submit an "Infrastructure" state implementation plan that provides for the "implementation, maintenance, and enforcement" of a National Ambient Air Quality Standard within three years of a standard's promulgation or revision. 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(1).

58. The Clean Air Act requires EPA to determine whether a state implementation plan submittal is administratively complete. See 42 U.S.C. 7410(k)(1)(B).

59. If a state fails to submit any required state implementation plan, there is no submittal that may be deemed administratively complete and EPA must make a determination stating that the state failed to submit the required state implementation plan. See 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B). This is referred to as a "finding of failure to submit."

60. Thus, if a state does not submit a state implementation plan, a finding of failure to submit must be made no later than six months after the date by which the state implementation plan submittal was due. See 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B).

61. EPA promulgated a revision to the PM2.5 24-hour National Ambient Air Quality Standard on October 17, 2006. 71 Fed. Reg. 61144 (Oct. 17, 2006).

62. The effective date of the 2006 PM2.5 standard is December 18, 2006. Id.

20 Wyoming.

21 118. Puerto Rico has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
22 addressing the infrastructure requirements under 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and
23 (E)-(M). Compare EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements— Puerto Rico
24 (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pr_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed
25 Dec. 6, 2010) with EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Pennsylvania
26 (available at http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pa_infrabypoll.html) (“Latest
27 Action” is blank for Puerto Rico’s 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M)
28 submittal requirements and listed as “Submission” for certain Pennsylvania requirements).

1 119. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
2 finding of failure to submit for Puerto Rico regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient
3 Air Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the requirements under
4 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M).

5 120. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for Puerto
6 Rico.

7 121. The District of Columbia has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan
8 or revision addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II). Compare EPA,
9 Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—District of Columbia (available at
10 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/dc_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6,
11 2010) with EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Pennsylvania (available at
12 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pa_infrabypoll.html) (“Latest Action” is blank
13 for the District of Columbia’s 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) submittal requirements and listed
14 as “Submission” for certain Pennsylvania requirements).

15 122. Though EPA has issued a proposed approval of the District of Columbia’s submittal
16 addressing the requirements of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2) for the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National
17 Ambient Air Quality Standard, the proposed approval, and the District of Columbia’s submittal,
18 did not include the requirements of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i). See 75 Fed. Reg. 27512 (May
19 17, 2010).

20 123. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
21 finding of failure to submit for the District of Columbia regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour
22 National Ambient Air Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the
23 requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II).

24 124. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for the
25 District of Columbia.

26 125. Indiana has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
27 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M).

28 Compare EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements— Indiana (available at

1 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/in_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6, 2010)
2 with EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Pennsylvania (available at
3 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pa_infrabypoll.html) (“Latest Action” is blank
4 for Indiana’s 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M) submittal requirements and

6 126. As previously stated, the Clean Air Act requires a state to submit a state implementation

9 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(1) (emphasis added).

10 127. EPA claims to have approved Indiana’s submittal addressing the PSD element of 42
11 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) on May 20, 2004. See EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure
12 Requirements—Indiana.

13 128. EPA cannot approve Indiana’s Infrastructure state implementation plan submittal
14 addressing the PSD element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) *two years before* the
15 promulgation of the 2006 PM_{2.5} National Ambient Air Quality standard.

16 129. Thus, Indiana has failed to submit a state implementation plan addressing the PSD
17 element of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II).

18 130. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
19 finding of failure to submit for Indiana regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient Air
20 Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the requirements under 42
21 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M).

22 131. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for

7 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(M).

8 134. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for Kansas.

9 135. Maine has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
10 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II). Compare EPA, Status of
11 State SIP Infrastructure Requirements— Maine (available at

12 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/me_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6,
13 2010) with EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Pennsylvania (available at
14 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pa_infrabypoll.html) (“Latest Action” is blank
15 for Maine’s 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) submittal requirements and listed as “Submission”

17 136. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
18 finding of failure to submit for Maine regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient Air
19 Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the requirements 42 U.S.C.
20 § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II).

21 137. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for Maine.

22 138. Pennsylvania has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
23 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II). See EPA, Status of State
24 SIP Infrastructure Requirements— Pennsylvania (available at

25 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pa_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6,
26 2010) (“Latest Action” is blank for 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II) submittal requirements and

1 139. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a

3 Ambient Air Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the
4 requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II).

5 140. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for
6 Pennsylvania.

7 141. Michigan has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
8 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) (the portion

21 143. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for
22 Michigan.

23 144. Minnesota has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
24 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) (the portion
25 addressing the PSD element) and (E)-(M). Compare EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure
26 Requirements— Minnesota (available at
27 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/mn_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 8,
28 2010) with EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Pennsylvania (available at

4 145. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
5 finding of failure to submit for Minnesota regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient
6 Air Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the requirements under
7 42 U.S.C. §§ 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) (the portion addressing the PSD element) and (E)-
8 (M).

9 146. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for
10 Minnesota.

11 147. Ohio has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
12 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D). Compare EPA, Status of State
13 SIP Infrastructure Requirements— Ohio (available at
14 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/oh_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6,

28 promulgation of the 2006 PM_{2.5} National Ambient Air Quality standard.

1 151. Thus, Ohio has failed to submit a state implementation plan addressing the PSD element
2 of 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D)(i)(II).

3 152. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
4 finding of failure to submit for Ohio regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient Air
5 Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the requirements under 42
6 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(D).

7 153. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for Ohio.

8 154. Wisconsin has failed to submit an Infrastructure state implementation plan or revision
9 addressing the requirements under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M).

10 Compare EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements— Wisconsin (available at
11 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/wi_infrabypoll.html) (last viewed Dec. 6,
12 2010) with EPA, Status of State SIP Infrastructure Requirements—Pennsylvania (available at
13 http://www.epa.gov/air/urbanair/sipstatus/reports/pa_infrabypoll.html) (“Latest Action” is blank
14 for Wisconsin’s 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M) submittal requirements
15 and listed as “Submission” for certain Pennsylvania requirements).

16 155. Accordingly, EPA has a mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to issue a
17 finding of failure to submit for Wisconsin regarding the 2006 PM_{2.5} 24-hour National Ambient
18 Air Quality Standard Infrastructure state implementation plan addressing the requirements under
19 42 U.S.C. § 7410(a)(2)(A)-(C), (D)(i)(II) and (E)-(M).

20 156. EPA has failed, and continues to fail, to make this finding of failure to submit for
21 Wisconsin.


22 157. Accordingly, EPA is violation of its mandatory duty under 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(1)(B) to
23 issue a finding of failure to submit sufficient Infrastructure state implementation plans for the
24 follow states and territories: Alaska, Colorado, Hawaii, Iowa, Idaho, Illinois, Louisiana,
25 Maryland, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Virginia,
26 Washington, Wyoming, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, Indiana, Kansas, Maine,
27 Pennsylvania, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio and Wisconsin.

REQUEST FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, WildEarth Guardians and Sierra Club respectfully request that the Court:

- A. Declare that the Administrator is in violation of the Clean Air Act with regard to her failure to perform each mandatory duty listed above;
- B. Issue a mandatory injunction requiring the Administrator to perform her mandatory duties by certain dates;
- C. Retain jurisdiction of this matter for purposes of enforcing and effectuating the Court's order;
- D. Grant WildEarth Guardians and Sierra Club their reasonable costs of litigation, including attorneys' and expert fees; and
- E. Grant such further relief as the Court deems just and proper.
